Christ Jesus, We are sorry for the times we have not allowed ourselves to be washed clean from our sins Christ, have mercy. CHRIST HAVE MERCY





John baptises Jesus in the river, and there is a voice from heaven that says something important.

Whose voice do you think it is? What does God say?



- Water is very important. It is used in baptism to show that we are starting a new life with God.
- But there are many other ways that we use water every day. *How many can you think* of?
- That's a lot of water! Are there any ways that we could save water so that we do not waste it?

Fabiano is a boy who lives in Uganda. In Uganda, the weather is often too dry to grow plants and it can be hard to get water.

Fabiano needs water to grow vegetables to eat and to sell. He used to walk to the next village for water because there were no taps in his own village. Fabiano had to carry the heavy buckets home. It was a long way and hard work.



With CAFOD's support, a water pump was built in Fabiano's community, powered by a solar panel that gets its energy from the sun. Now Fabiano can easily fill his watering can. His vegetables are growing very well!



We all need water to live but many people around the world don't have clean water to drink, or they have to travel a very long way to get any water at all. Can you imagine what that would be like?

What do you think we could do to help more people like Fabiano and his family?

We pray for those we love and care for in the silence of our hearts. Hold them in your love and look after them, Lord.


We ask Mother Mary to join with us, as we say:
