Read for at least 5 minutes OUT LOUD every day - you can read to anyone: mum, dad, baby sister, cuddly toy, down the phone to Gran or even to yourself in the mirror! Record your daily reading in your Home School Diary. You need to hit your Accelerated Reader Points Target each Half Term.	Play at least 5 minutes of TTRS every day, and aim to have your name on the Daily Top 5 leader board and earn the TTRS Trophy every week!  Focus on a times table that you know you need to learn and practise it in the 'jamming' section before you play in other areas.	Create a paper prayer chain. Each week, add on a new link that says thank you, sorry, or asks for help with something that is on your mind. Is there a specific person, event, or place you would like to pray for? Use your Home Reading Diary for prayer ideas!	Science Create a sculpture using whatever materials you have at home to demonstrate the structure and functions of the human heart.
Write a diary entry from the point of view of someone in a country that is being colonised by the British Empire.  It must be over 400 words, or at least 2 pages long if written by hand.	Spend at least 10 minutes each week on Maths Flex to keep working along your pathway.	Write your own prayer for healing - consider what sort of healing you are asking for, or who you are asking to be healed. Use what we have explored in Scripture and about the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to help develop your language choices.	Geography  Design and conduct a survey to find out how eco-friendly and sustainable your home is. What are you already doing at home to help the environment? What could you be doing better?
Read and perform a poem that is at least 12 lines long. Think carefully about expression and pace when you perform it to the class at the end of the Summer Term!	Design a Maths quiz or board game that we can have a go at the end of term. It must link to 2D/3D shapes and Geometry	Choose one of the Key Principles of Catholic Social Teaching and create a poster/presentation for KS1 children, explaining what it is and how to live it out in daily life	Art  Create a piece of artwork, representing whatever subject you like, using what you have learned about pointilism.
