My Jesus, My Saviour, Lord there is no one like you, All of my days, I want to praise The wonders of Your mighty love.





Christ Jesus, for the times we have not forgiven others when they have hurt us. Christ, have mercy. CHRIST HAVE MERCY


Lord Jesus, for the times we have stood by when we have seen something we know is wrong. Lord, have mercy.



A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew: **Glory to you O Lord** 



- Then the Spirit led Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the Devil. After spending forty days and nights without food, Jesus was hungry. Then the Devil came to him and said, "If you are God's Son, order these stones to turn into bread."
- But Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Human beings cannot live on bread alone, but need every word that God speaks."
- Then the Devil took Jesus to Jerusalem, the Holy City, set him on the highest point of the Temple, and said to him, "If you are God's Son, throw yourself down, for the scripture says,
- 'God will give orders to his angels about you; they will hold you up with their hands, so that not even your feet will be hurt on the stones.'"

- Jesus answered, "But the scripture also says, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test."
- Then the Devil took Jesus to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in all their greatness. "All this I will give you," the Devil said, "if you kneel down and worship me."
- Then Jesus answered, "Go away, Satan! The scripture says, 'Worship the Lord your God and serve only him!'"

# Time to reflect on God's words for us today.



Jesus spent a long time in the desert.

Do you know what a desert is?



- It is a place with very little rain, where there is no water to drink and where plants cannot grow.
- After Jesus spent time in the desert, he was hungry.
- Have you ever been hungry? What did it feel like?

Then Jesus had to make some choices. First, he had the choice to either rely on God or turn stones into bread. Even though he was very hungry, Jesus chose to trust in God.

Jesus was also offered all the kingdoms of the world if he turned away from God. It must have been very tempting to choose all the riches of all the kingdoms and to have power over them. But Jesus chose not to turn away from God.

Why do you think Jesus said no when he was tempted?

Jesus is God's son. He knows that riches and power can never be as important as God's love.

- Can you think of a time when you have been tempted to do something even though you knew it wasn't right? What happened next?
- Sometimes we can make really good choices, like Jesus did. We can choose to do what is right even when it's hard. Like standing up for someone in the playground, or pointing out when others are being mean. Or sharing when we'd really like to keep things to ourselves.

We can also choose not to do something we know is wrong, even if we really want to. It takes a lot of strength to make the right choices.

### What or who gives you strength?

We can find strength in God's love for us, in the love of our friends and family who care for us and help us, and in the food we eat to keep our bodies strong and healthy.

- Lent is a time when we try to turn back to God. We say sorry for the things that we have done wrong and we try to make a change to live as God wants us to.
- This is not always easy, but God's love is there to give us strength to make better choices. And the people who love us are there to support us too.
- This Lent, let's think about how we can make good choices just like Jesus did in the desert even when we find it hard.
- As we do this, let's also think if there's anything that we can do to help our sisters and brothers around the world to stay strong in difficult times.
- What good choices will you try to make this week? And how will you help to give others strength when they need it?

### **Our Faith in Action**




This week let us show the Gospel Value of Justice and the Virtue of Charity.
